



ZAP 'EM AND WHACK 'EM!

Control without unsightly brownout.

Here's the dilemma many landscape operators face: Do I use a herbicide to get lasting control, or do I use a string trimmer and avoid the "brownout," even though I know the weeds will grow back?



The Zap and Whack method is an easy and efficient way to maintain clean fencelines, and avoid "brownout" appearance.

Here's the solution: Zap 'em with Roundup Pro® or Roundup ProDry™ herbicide, wait three days for the herbicide to move into the roots, then whack 'em with a string trimmer while they are still green. Result: Control with no noticeable brownout.

Two Powerful Tools

String trimmers have their place in the fight against problem weeds, but sometimes they can only do part of the job. Herbicides can do the job, but sometimes the customer or the public doesn't appreciate the browned-out look, especially if weeds are fairly tall.

Roundup Pro and Roundup ProDry, because they move through the plant into the root system, are the perfect partners for your string trimmer. While your crew is working at a site, have them spray tall weeds along fences or in other hard-to-mow areas. After three days have someone with a string trimmer whack the weeds down to the ground. With Roundup Pro or Roundup ProDry in their roots, they shouldn't come back. And no one will see brownout. It requires two trips, one for the herbicide and one for the trimmer. But unlike the mechanical-only option, which can require two or more trips per season, the zap 'em, whack 'em option gets rid of the weeds. That means the next time your crew goes to the site, they won't have to waste time trimming around fences or poles or other areas. They can mow and go.
