
I am concerned because of the plans the biotech company Monsanto has to acquire Delta & Pine Land company, and I hope you will be willing to investigate the anti-competitive business this company employs.

Monsanto's practices are disheartening and are leaving farmers like me with a lack of choices. Genetic traits in seeds allow me to yield more crops at less cost. Unfortunately, right now I only have Monsanto's traits available to me, and these are certainly not priced competitively and don't always provide what we need.

If Monsanto continues to enjoy this monopoly, farmers who depend on these biotech traits will not be able to buy traits at competitive prices or find the best traits for their crops. Competition would provide us with more traits at a lower cost, which will help our consumers as well.

I believe competition and choice are good for business. I hope you will agree with me that Monsanto's business dealings need to be investigated.
